National Initiative to Support Older Persons Traumatized by Elder Abuse

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The **South African Older** Persons Act 13 of 2006, defines abuse of an older person in Sect 30 (2) as; "any conduct or lack of appropriate action occurring within any relationship where there is an expectation of trust, that causes harm or distress or is likely to cause harm or distress to an older person."

Definition of Elder Abuse



A 2017 review of 52 studies in 28 countries from diverse regions estimated that

15.7% (1 in 6 persons) aged 60 and over, globally, have experienced some form of abuse.'

Approximately '1 in 10 persons over the age of 65 have experienced some level of abuse.'

Only 4% of elder abuse cases are reported WHO

Prevalence of Elder Abuse



- Ageing Population
- Multicultural population
 - Widespread poverty
- High Unemployment rates
 - •HIV / Aids epidemic

Unique categories of elder abuse

- Loss of respect for elders
 - Systemic abuse
- Particular violent forms of abuse
- Allegations of witchcraft (Kotze 2018)

Context in Developing Countries



Purpose of the National Helpline

•Provides a platform for family members, concerned citizens or older persons to report abuse and open pathways for the elder to receive help, support and treatment regarding the abuse.

•Create a channel for the collation and analysis of statistics on this human rights problem which will help to inform policy formulation and programme development to promote the safety, dignity and integrity of older persons.

Operational Model

Launched – 23rd November 2023



Main aim is to provide a confidential telephone counselling service that offers:

crises management, short term counselling referrals to appropriate resources

Provides services to callers from all nine provinces in South Africa, at no cost to them 7 days a week between 7am to 5pm.

Provides an uncomplicated platform for reporting and addressing abuse which safeguards older persons from further trauma, cognitive decline, physical injury and financial stress caused by the abuse.



Strengths of the Initiative

1. Creates a powerful space for older people who feel unsafe, afraid, disrespected and traumatized to express their concerns and reach out for help.

2. Many lived in silence with abuse as they lacked knowledge on how to report it or the means to travel to service points, especially in rural areas.

The Helpline brings the services to the door of the victim through a network of service providers.





ELDER ABUSE IS A GLOBAL HEALTH CARE CONCERN.

Comprehensive strategy needed to combat elder abuse and develop resilience in older persons.

The National Toll-free Helpline for Elder Abuse provides:

- A resource for older persons to report abuse
- Linkages to trained counsellors to support, counsel and inform elders traumatized by abuse.
- Linkages to safe houses or residential care centres where necessary.
- A platform for collating vital statistics to inform programme & policy development to address elder abuse at a macro level.
